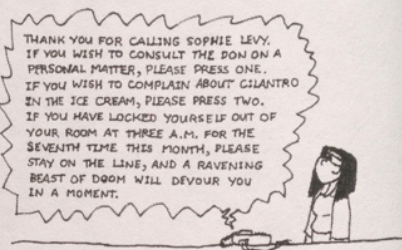
A Note from the Don(na)

In (and Out of) the News

There's no feeling more unsettling for a journalist than the angst of missing an important news story.

The 2001-02 crop of Southam Fellows gathered with the Massey community in the Junior Common Room on Sept. 11, dumbstruck as the video of two planes crashing into the World Trade Centre played over and over like a recurring nightmare. Mixed with the incomprehensible horror was the panicky feeling that, as reporters, we had to get to work. We felt the magnetic pull of our newsrooms, the anxious desire to pitch in and help cover the most significant story we'd ever witnessed.

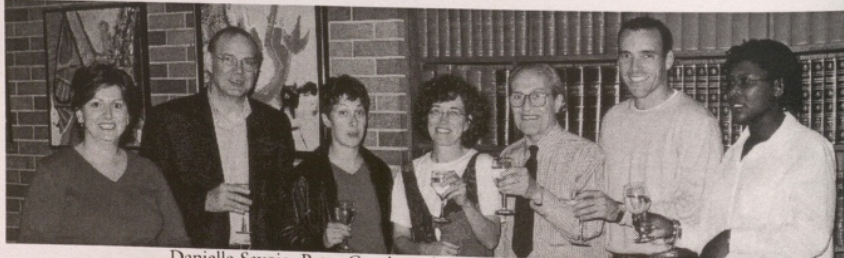
But we were on sabbatical and had agreed to leave work behind as we pursued eight months of academic study at the U of T. So we sat and paced and kept returning to the television. We experienced a major world event as outsiders for the first time in years. Unable to busy our minds with the task of telling the story, we were left to feel and witness the anguish without the frenzy of deadlines that tend to be a way of coping.

Sept. 11 became the focus of our academic year. We used our time and the University's vast resources to scratch the surface of what events and conditions had led to that day. The Southams invited speaker after speaker to our twice-weekly seminars to help explain U.S. foreign policy, Middle Eastern politics, Islam and Canadian security laws. Some fellows took courses on religion and Middle Eastern studies.

On our trip to New York City we met with security officials, spoke with police officers, and stood at Ground Zero, paralysed by the open anguish of relatives and by the scene of workers, police and firefighters clearing away the rubble.

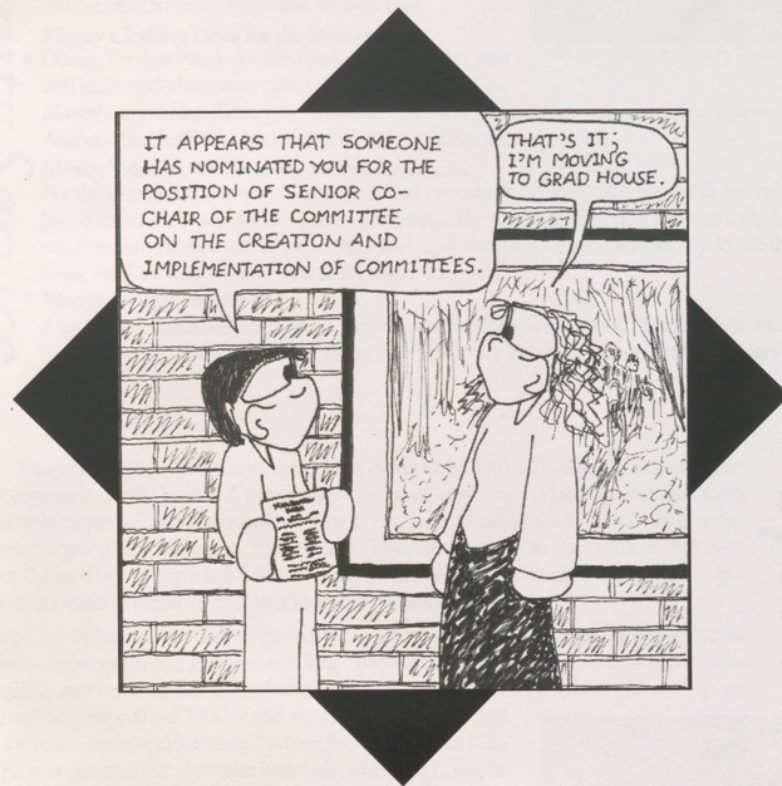
The initial panic of not being able to cover the story gave way to a sense that we were extremely fortunate. We had a rare gift of time to delve into the issues related to Sept. 11 and the resources to do it at a top Canadian university. Hopefully we take a measure of understanding and context back to our work in journalism.

Community Service

The Community Services Committee was involved with four initiatives this year:

Massey College Tutoring & Mentorship Program

The mission of the Massey College Tutoring and Mentorship Program is “to provide tutoring, mentorship and enrichment to high school students who have demonstrated the desire to explore their potential, but who are not achieving their academic goals.” The program has matched 21 Junior Fellows with 12 high school students for tutoring and mentorship on a weekly basis for 6 months.

Massey Clothing Drive for the Homeless

• During the three week donation period in December, over 280 items of clothing were collected from members of the Massey community. These much-needed items were given to three local charitable organizations: Anishnawbe Health Toronto, Sistering, and the Salvation Army.

Massey Valentine-O-Gram Fundraiser for Charity

For the second year in a row, Masseyites had an opportunity to send valentine wishes and chocolates to other members of the Massey community. The Quadrangle Society was extremely generous to cover all costs associated with this initiative, allowing the Junior Fellowship to donate the entire \$497.50 raised to the “Out of the Cold” Program.

Massey College Blood Drive

• Massey’s first annual Blood Drive was organized in collaboration with the Health Committee. Two trips to the blood bank were arranged so that Junior Fellows could donate blood together.

Massey College enjoyed a number of athletic events in the 2001 – 2002 academic year. Oscar Guerra organized weekly basketball games with Matthew Peros’ help. Masseyites oversubscribed the venerable squash ladder and demanded a ping-pong ladder to satisfy their ladder-climbing urges. A Massey team fought hard in the autumn innertube waterpolo tournament but was narrowly defeated by a strong Medcs side. The autumn also brought a rock-climbing expedition and numerous recreational games of ultimate frisbee, ball hockey, and soccer.

A palace coup in January saw John Neary deposed from the position of sports coordinator amid allegations of corruption and influence-peddling. Backed by a small but zealous faction, Matthew Peros quickly assumed command. The bitter winter months saw a greater emphasis on indoor sports and recreation. SuperBowl XXXVI and the Olympics were viewed with much enthusiasm, and two chess sets were purchased for the JCR. Sarah Flicker organized our innertube waterpolo team, which, despite some setbacks, did us proud in the University of Toronto league matches. “It was a rebuilding year,” a passionate Matthew Sullivan recounted, “but we’re looking forward to the new young talent arriving in September.” Yes indeed, the future of Massey sports has never looked brighter.

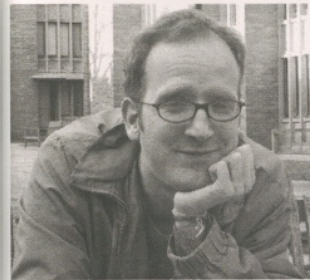

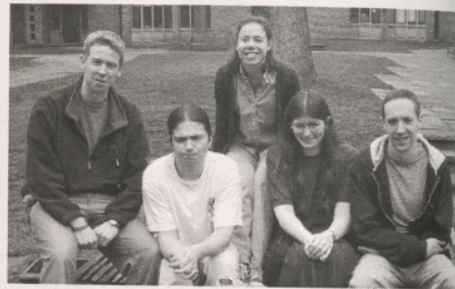

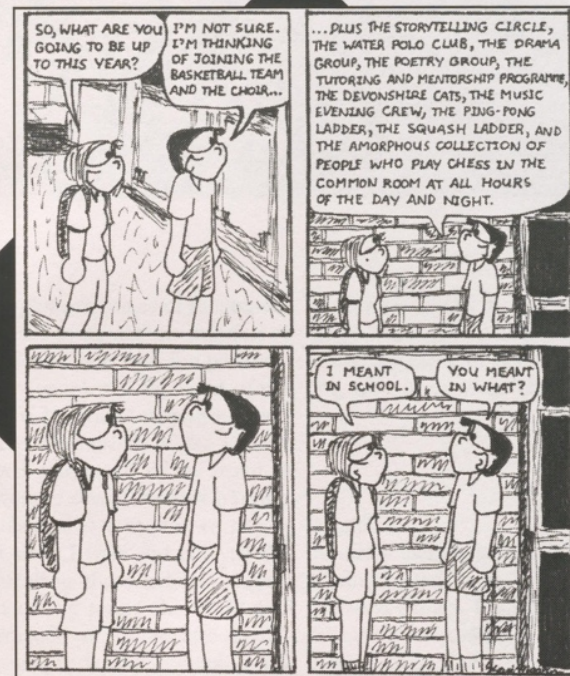

Tutoring & Mentorship

The Massey College Tutoring and Mentorship Programme (MCTMP), introduced during the 2001/02 academic year, was organized by Junior Fellows in partnership with the Toronto District School Board. Twelve Oakwood Collegiate Institute students (ranging from grades ten to OAC) were carefully selected for the six-month programme, with preference given to students belonging to groups underrepresented in the university system.

The mission of the MCTMP is to "provide tutoring, mentorship and enrichment to high school students who have demonstrated the desire to explore their potential, but who are not achieving their academic goals." The programme was structured so that our 21 Junior Fellow mentors could meet their students at Massey College on Saturday or Sunday and provide assistance with coursework in Mathematics, Science and English. Some of our students have dramatically improved their academic performance. Some have realised that attending university is a realistic and desirable goal. Others have valued the opportunity to ask their mentors for non-academic

advice. It has become clear that the benefit to our students was much broader than academics alone. Each of them has had the unique opportunity to learn from very talented and experienced graduate student mentors who were enthusiastic about devoting some of their time to help make an impact on the lives of their students.

The creation and operation of the MCTMP would not have been possible without the generosity and support of the Master, the College Officers and Staff, the Quadrangle Society, the School Board's Community Advisor, Oakwood Collegiate Institute's Guidance Department, the Don of Hall, and the Junior Fellowship; on behalf of the entire MCTMP team, please accept our deep and sincere thanks. The feedback from mentors and students has generally been very positive during the MCTMP's inaugural year. We look forward to helping more students achieve their goals next year and for many years to come!
